

## **Research Assistant/Associate in Rehabilitation Research**

The Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health (SSHSPH) at the National University of Singapore (NUS) is recruiting a Research Assistant/Associate in rehabilitation research. This is a full-time position based in Singapore.

Duties may include but are not limited to: (1) conduct literature reviews; (2) recruit research participants; (3) interview, observe and administer questionnaires to the participants; (4) manage data; (5) assist data analyses; (6) contribute to the development of scientific papers and the dissemination of the study findings.

The appointed candidate should: (1) hold a Master's Degree and (2) have some experience in applied health, behavioral and/or social science research.

The ideal candidate should demonstrate: (1) an interest in rehabilitation and clinical research; (2) ability to draft an Institutional Research Board (IRB) protocol and application; (3) ability to work with individuals with health conditions and their healthcare providers; and (4) knowledge of both quantitative and qualitative methods in applied health and/or social sciences. Strong interpersonal skills are required to work with both research patients and their healthcare providers. Fluency in English, as well as demonstrably good writing and analytic skills are essential. Knowledge of Mandarin, Chinese dialects, Malay or Tamil will be an advantage.

The position is a 1-year contract in the first instance and could be extended.
