#### **Lao PDR**

A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed with Lao TPHI (Tropical and Public Health Institute) with the intention of developing teaching and research collaborations. The creation of an office in Lao, with TPHI as partner institution, has been approved and will be launched in September 2022.

#### **ADVANCE ID**

The ADVANCE ID (ADVANcing Clinical Evidence in Infectious Diseases) **network** (funded for 36 months) will conduct research to develop the most effective ways to treat and prevent life-threatening drugresistant infections. As a host for the network, the School will be working closely with local partners – namely the NUS Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, Duke-NUS Medical School, Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine in Nanyang Technological University as well as National Centre for Infectious Diseases – to carry out clinical trials related to drug-resistant infections. The Singapore Clinical Research Institute (SCRI) is also actively supporting multiple work streams for the Network.
