Regional offices & Networks

Cambodia: The UHS-SSHSPH Integrated Research Programme (USIRP) is a collaborative venture between the University of Health Sciences (UHS) in Cambodia and the Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health (SSHSPH) at the National University of Singapore (NUS). Launched in October 2014 with a focus on tuberculosis and antimicrobial resistance, USIRP has evolved under USIRP II (October 2019 - December 2024) to encompass a broader array of public health priorities in Cambodia and Southeast Asia. This expansion includes research areas such as HIV/AIDS, infection prevention and control, maternal and child health, sexual and reproductive health, non-communicable diseases, and mental health.

The programme operates under an implementation research framework, aiming to develop and assess cost-effective interventions for healthcare access and improved outcomes, particularly in vulnerable populations. Collaborations extend to national programs, UN agencies, donor agencies, and NGOs, ensuring stakeholder involvement and translating findings into policy and action. The initiative has expanded its reach to Lao PDR, collaborating with the Lao Tropical and Public Health Institute. The dynamic team supporting USIRP comprises faculty, researchers, students, and staff with diverse expertise in behavioral sciences, implementation sciences, health promotion, health economics, and statistics, enhancing the programme's potential for significant public health impact.

Lao PDR

The NUS SSHSPH - Lao PDR Programme was launched on 7 February 2023 in partnership with the Lao Tropical and Public Health Institute (Lao TPHI) in Vientiane Capital, of the Lao People's Democratic Republic (Lao PDR). The programme focuses on research, education, and training, offering courses and grants for researchers in Lao PDR to collaborate with NUS researchers. Its primary objective is to foster partnerships, strengthen capacity, and support evidence-informed policies in public health aligned with the Ministry of Health's priorities.

In the first two years, the programme has successfully collaborated with local partners, including Lao TPHI and the University of Health Sciences of Lao PDR (UHS Laos). Together, they have achieved several key milestones such as collaborative teaching activities, ongoing research projects and awarding of travel fellowships to further strengthen collaborative efforts.

The programme plays a pivotal role in supporting research collaborations between Lao PDR researchers and NUS SSHSPH, through the NUS SSHSPH - Lao PDR Programme Research Grant (NUS SSHSPH – Lao PDR PRG). It provides funding and collaboration opportunities for exploratory and developmental research projects in their early stages conducted in Lao PDR. The first seed grant call received twelve applications, and three seed grants have been awarded.

ADVANCE ID

The ADVANCE ID (ADVANcing Clinical Evidence in Infectious Diseases) **network** (funded for 36 months) will conduct research to develop the most effective ways to treat and prevent life-threatening drugresistant infections. As a host for the network, the School will be working closely with local partners – namely the NUS Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, Duke-NUS Medical School, Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine in Nanyang Technological University as well as National Centre for Infectious Diseases – to carry out clinical trials related to drug-resistant infections. The Singapore Clinical Research Institute (SCRI) is also actively supporting multiple work streams for the Network.

Other International Relations

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between SSHSPH and Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF) to formalise the partnership between the two entities.

The Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health hosted the ASEAN Priority Setting Exercise from 13 to 14 June 2024. As part of this exercise, the School convened a panel of public health experts in ASEAN to discuss the challenges faced in this region; and to explore how the partnership between academia, industry and governments can enhance regional public health cooperation and address major health challenges in ASEAN countries through strategic collaboration between NUS and respective governments. The meeting report will be released in the future.

On 14 to 15 June 2024, the Southeast Asia Regional Collaborative for Health (SEARCH) organised a series of meetings and gathered regional SEARCH collaborators alongside policymakers and health system leaders from across ASEAN, China and India. The meetings intended to allow networking, collaboration and mutual learning on the topics of strategic health purchasing and primary care in aforementioned regions. Topics discussed were related to research framework and output planning (policy briefs, peer-reviewed articles), formalising the network and establishing an expert database,

overview of HTA (existing challenges and alternative pathway with high-cost medicines and role in health financing functions) and health financing at various levels.
